Dear Gentlemen:

Item 450 B.3 of Chapter 3 of the 2012 Special Session I Acts of Assembly, requires the Commissioner of Highways to develop a report on the cash balances of the Route 58 Corridor Development Fund. The language specifically requires that the report include three items: (i) a comparison of actual spending to allocations by project and district; (ii) expenditures by project, district, and funding source, and (iii) a six-year plan for planned future expenditures from the Fund by project and district. In addition to the requirements of the legislation, the report also includes background information on the program relating to previous actions by the General Assembly and the Commonwealth Transportation Board.

Allocations and expenditures included in the attached report are show as of April 30, 2012. The total expenditures were \$1.168 billion for the Route 58 Corridor Development Fund. This includes \$416 million in Bristol District, \$80 million in Hampton Roads District, \$145 million in Lynchburg District, \$247 million in Richmond District, and \$280 million in Salem District. 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#### **Executive Summary**

Item 450 B.3. of Chapter 3 of the 2012 Special Session I Acts of Assembly, directs the Commissioner of Highways to report on the cash balances in the Route 58 Corridor Development Fund. The report shall include: (i) a comparison of actual spending to allocations by project and district, (ii) expenditures by project, district and funding sources and (iii) a six-year plan for planned future expenditures from the Fund by project and district.

Allocations and expenditures are shown as of April 30, 2012. Total expenditures were \$1.168 billion for the Route 58 Corridor Development Program. This includes \$416 million in Bristol District, \$80 million in Hampton Roads District, \$145 million in Lynchburg District, \$247 million in Richmond District, and \$280 million in Salem District.

#### Program Background

- 1989 General Assembly Actions:
  - Authorized the U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Fund and Program.
  - Authorized \$600 million in revenue bonds.
  - Designated first \$40 million of recordation tax revenues for program funding.
- 1999 General Assembly Actions:
  - Increased the debt authorization for the U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program by \$104.3 million.
  - Specified projects within the U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Program to benefit from the increased debt authorization as follows:

-	Pennington Gap to Dryden in Lee County	\$ 35.6 million
-	Anticipated shortfall on the Danville Bypass,

The 1999 Appropriation Act included language which required the Secretary of Transportation and the Governor to propose funding to support debt service on the additional debt authorization.

#### <u>Program Background (Continued)</u>

- Commonwealth Transportation Board Actions:
  - Issued \$200 million in transportation revenue bonds in December 1989.
  - Adopted U. S. Route 58 Corridor Economic Development Program in May 1992.
  - Issued \$98.7 million in transportation revenue bonds in June 1993.
  - Issued \$114.3 million in transportation revenue bonds in November 1996.
  - Issued \$204.9 million in transportation revenue bonds in November 1999.
  - Issued \$102.1 million in transportation revenue bonds in September 2001.

#### **Program Expenditures and Balances**

- As of April 30, 2012, program expenditures were \$1.168 billion.
- U. S. Route 58 Corridor Development Fund Balance \$34 million.
  - Fund balance designated for priority projects identified in the SYIP and debt service payment on the bonds. (Balance reflects transfers out to pay May 15, 2012 debt service to Route 58 Bondholders.)
- Series 2001B bond proceeds balance \$799,000.
  - Amount held by Trustee designated for Taylor Valley project specified by the 1999 General Assembly.
- Designated Virginia Transportation Act of 2000 (VTA 2000) funding has been fully allocated to complete construction projects and priority projects previously identified.
  - \$113 million of VTA 2000 funds have been allocated. The VTA 2000 fund balance is \$8 million.

- Transportation Partnership Opportunity Fund (TPOF).
  - \$77 million of TPOF funds have been allocated to the Hillsville Bypass PPTA Project. This project is part of the Route 58 Development Program. The TPOF balance is \$3 million.
- 2012 General Assembly Actions:
  - Directs the Commissioner of Highways to report on or before July 1 of each year to the Chairmen of the House Appropriations and Senate Finance Committees on the cash balances in the Route 58 Corridor Development Fund.
  - In addition, the report shall include the following:
    - i) Comparison of actual spending to allocations by project and district;
      - Attachment A compares allocations by project and district as programmed in the FY 2012-2017 SYIP to actual spending.
    - ii) Expenditures by project, district and funding sources since inception;
      - Attachment B provides expenditures by project, district and funding sources.
    - iii) Six-year plan for planned future expenditures from the Fund by project and district. As of the date of this report, the FY13-18 SYIP is in draft format and may change when the final version is approved.
      - Attachment C includes active projects in the FY 2013-2018 SYIP.
