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NEW TRAFFIC PATTERN IN PLACE AS ROUTE 134 BRIDGE REPLACEMENT PROJECT REACHES MILESTONE

Northbound traffic will travel on the new bridge as early as Nov. 3

YORK COUNTY/HAMPTON— Starting as early as Tues. Nov. 3, motorists traveling along Route 134 (Magruder Boulevard/Hampton Highway) can expect a new traffic pattern, with a single-lane of traffic shifted to the newly constructed northbound bridge.

Northbound traffic will use the right lane of the newly constructed bridge while southbound traffic continues in the right lane of the existing bridge. Left lanes in both directions remain closed while remaining construction work continues. A long-term closure remains in place to through traffic on Old Armistead Avenue at the Magruder Boulevard intersection during this traffic shift; however, access will be maintained for local businesses and residences.

As part of the Route 134 Bridge Replacement Project, the aging northbound bridge was replaced with a new bridge consisting of two 12-foot travel lanes, a 10-foot right shoulder and a 6-foot left shoulder.
