## 2023 Local Programs Workshop The Founders Inn and Spa September 11th-14th



The eleventh annual Local Programs Workshop will be held in Virginia Beach at The Founders Inn and Spa. This workshop will focus on providing an overview of local programs and will provide training for program management and project development. This will bring together local government, Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), and private sector staff to discuss the delivery of the local transportation program. In addition to the plenary sessions, the workshop will feature 20 breakout sessions scheduled in four concurrent tracks over the two-day workshop. This workshop is intended for local public agency staff that have oversight of locally administered projects or works with projects receiving special funding from various programs, as well as consultants and VDOT staff that are involved in locally administered projects.




#### **NEW IIJA Locally Request Form**

#### Three Year Re-Certification

The recent launch of the Three-Year Re-Certification has been a success. Over 90 certificate holders have been re-certified. In order to maintain a "Qualified" status, certificate holders must take the on-line re-qualification course. Certificate holders will be notified by email roughly one month prior to their certificate expiration date. All certificate holders have 30 days to complete the on-line, self-paced eight-to-ten-hour session which includes lectures, videos, quizzes and resource links. Certificate holders that fail to meet the completion date deadline lose their "Qualified" status. If they wish to regain their "Qualified" status, they will need to retake the entire Qualification Program.

#### **Transportation Project Management Institute (TPMI) Training Program**

The Transportation Project Management Institute (TPMI) is an eight-day intensive residential training program exclusively designed for managing the development phase of transportation projects. This year's program will take place at the Boar's Head Resort from May 15-18 and May 22-25. The program's objective is to enhance the knowledge and skills of project managers in order to complete projects on-time and on-budget. The program has been developed specifically for project management practitioners from Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT), local government, and private consulting firms. Participants will be able to directly apply their learning of project management principles, practices, and techniques to their day-to-day jobs.

#### **Scholarships**

To encourage local government participation in the TPMI, the VDOT's Local Assistance Division (LAD) is partnering with the University of Virginia (UVA) Center for Transportation Studies to offer two full scholarships (entire cost of the institute) to eligible local government staff. Local staff must first send their applications to UVA Center of Transportation Studies (CTS) by March 24th, 2023 for eligibility determination, and state on their application that they wish to be considered for the VDOT scholarship. (Applicants who are accepted to TPMI but do not receive a scholarship are still eligible to attend.) Applicants will be notified of scholarship awards the week of April 3rd. Scholarship evaluation criteria includes local government size, locality participation in VDOT funded programs, and the applicant's project management responsibilities. #### **Revenue Sharing Webinar Application Process**

The Local Assistance Division will be holding a Revenue Sharing Applicant Workshop for Local Governments and VDOT District personnel on Wednesday, May 10, 2023 from 9am-noon. The webinar will review program eligibility and the application process for the upcoming application cycle which begins May 15, 2023 with the opening of the pre-applications. Register Now!



### **Revenue Sharing Application Process**

The Revenue Sharing application process will begin in May of 2023 for funds to be allocated in FY27 and FY28 with projects selected added to the FY25 SYIP. The Revenue Sharing Program requires a pre-application to be submitted in order to submit a full application. The Smart Portal will open on May 15, 2023, with pre-applications being accepted until June 30, 2023. Preapplications will be evaluated by Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) District and Central Office staff during the screening process and screened in applications will become available as full applications. The Smart Portal will open on August 15, 2023, for full applications and will close on October 2, 2023, with no exceptions. All supporting documentation, including the resolution, must be uploaded into the online portal and submitted by the deadline. ### **State of Good Repair (SGR) - Primary Extensions FY24 Applications**

The recent FY24 applications received an exception to the federal process due to the increased cost of materials and inflation. Virginia Department of Transportation (VDOT) received applications for the FY24 SGR Primary Extension Program. Scoring and project selecting will be complete by April 1, 2023 and localities will be advised of tentative project selections at that time. The FY24 project selections anticipated to be funded by July 1, 2023. Advertisement is required by June 30, 2024 and any federal exception will be re-evaluated for the next round of applications.

#### **Sustainable Performance Report**

January 26, 2023, Russ Dudley, Local Assistance Division Administrator sent a <u>letter</u> to each locality that provided an update on the Locality Sustained Performance Program. The new program is a proactive approach to track, monitor, evaluate, and support local partners experiencing the largest challenges delivering their current project portfolio. Beginning October 2023, VDOT will annually review the performance of localities administering five or more projects using three performance metrics designed to reflect the partnership between VDOT and the localities.


#### **Metrics:**

- On-time project development for current and past projects.
- Reasonable progress, the ability to complete a scheduled authorization milestone within an acceptable time.
- Unexpended allocations, a measure of VDOT's expenditures compared to funding currently available.

#### **Size of the Locally Administered Program**




The Commitment List tracks planned calendar year (CY) advertisement commitments for locally administered projects. At the beginning of CY23, localities planned to advertise 204 projects with estimated \$630M CN value. To date, 150 projects have been advertised with a CN value of \$280M.
